Redesignated as 959 Surgical Operations Squadron on 30 Nov 2020. Activated on 15 Dec 2020. Redesignated at Fort Sam Houston Surgical Operations Squadron on 8 Sep 2025.

**Assignments.** 59 Surgical Operations (later, 59 Inpatient Operations) Group, 1 Apr 1998; 59 Medical Operations Group, 28 Oct 2010-16 Nov 2012. 959 Medical (later, Fort Sam Houston Medical) Group, 15 Dec 2020-.


