**Lineage.** Constituted as 731 Air Materiel Squadron on 4 Apr 1945. Activated on 13 Jun 1945.

Inactivated on 7 Nov 1945. Disbanded on 8 Oct 1948. Reconstituted and redesignated as 731

Munitions Support Squadron, and activated, on 1 Aug 1996. Inactivated on 20 Jun 2001.

Redesignated as 731 Munitions Squadron on 17 Jul 2009. Activated on 31 Jul 2009.
