53 Wing (ACC)

Lineage. Established as 53 Pursuit Group (Interceptor) on 20 Nov 1940. Activated on 15 Jan 1941. Redesignated as 53 Fighter Group on 15 May 1942. Disbanded on 1 May 1944. Reestablished, and redesignated as 53 Fighter Group (Air Defense), on 20 Jun 1955. Activated on 18 Aug 1955. Discontinued on 1 Apr 1960. Redesignated as 53 Tactical Fighter Group on 31 Jul 1985. Consolidated (25 Sep 1995) with the USAF Tactical Air Warfare Center, which was organized on 1 Nov 1963. Redesignated as: USAF Air Warfare Center on 1 Oct 1991; 53 Wing on 1 Oct 1995.
