
This week I received letters from Father, mother, Sam & F.W.R. all telling me know glad they were going to be. They sure made me homesick for I'm in an awful place here. It is all O.K. at night but in the day one can't work in the cold & I've caught an awful cold trying it. We haven't but two more weeks before we leave tho. I'll sure be glad to get back to my regiment. It will feel like home. But just to get south of the Mason-Dixon line will do right now. I'm tired of the North.

We are doing some very interesting and practical work here tho. These tractors are wonderful. Why I couldn't believe my eyes yesterday when I saw a little "45" pull 57 tons of pig iron around like it wasn't any thing. Why the rougher the road & the muddier the more the load. These tractors would be wonder in the swamps getting out timber. I believe I like this work better than the trucks. There is more chance to do something new here. Yesterday I took several pictures of the tractors doing things. I hope they will turn out O.K. If so I'll send you some.

This week end I have spent here. Peoria is a right large town but there is nothing doing. It is most a manufacturing town. We came back to camp last night at 10^{30} because every thing was closing up. I got a letter from Mr. Wright telling of his friends wife sickness and that he couldn't come over. Was very sorry to here (sic) it too.



W^m & I enjoyed our stay in Charlotte and Davidson very much indeed. Got into Charlotte real late - about 1230 A.M. Sunday morning. (I should have said early shouldn't I?) Aunt Janie, Uncle Mell & Frank D. met us. Went to Davidson in Buick arriving about 12 o'clock. Mrs. Vinson was waiting for us on the front porch. We certainly enjoyed seeing her and all the others. We saw most everybody, I think. Maynard, Guy, Laveres Thomas, Frank Hall, Mrs. Johnston, & Miss Maud at with us. We left about 3³⁰ & had to make a hurried trip back for Wm to catch his train. 

I am gradually learning how to maneuver (?) around in this burg. It isn't very hard.



How I wish you and father could have come up for this week at least. I would have loved to have had my sisters too and brother – I can't have everything like I want it tho.



I hear that the observers are to be made 1st Lieutenants on April first. That's a fine something to hear, isn't it? I hope it is true.



> Very close to "Somewhere" at Sea March 25th, 1918

Dearest Mother,

Today is our eleventh day at sea and I must say I am getting tired of it. We hope to land tomorrow tho and then I hope to be able to say that "all is well" so far.

The night out of New York I felt fine and the next morning I didn't feel badly but about 11:00 A.M. I didn't have to ask anybody what to do. Since then I have never been in better health – outwardly my "morale" was good too. I have had a very enjoyable voyage considering.

The first day out ten Lieutenants were selected a "lookouts" from the "crow's nest"—also a detail of men was made up to be used for the same purpose. 2 men and 1 Lt. Went up at a time. 3 men in the "Foretop" and three in the "main top." I was assigned to the former. It required a little nerve to climb up the first time—for the "crow's nest" is about 60 or 70 ft. from the deck and when the wind is blowing hard—the mast sways back and forth—causing rather a nervous feeling. All of the "observers" on board has this job assigned to them. There are about 8 of us on board—and 1 pilot.

The men are mostly "casuals." Men who were in quarantine when their units went over. Consequently it is more of a mob than anything else. The average intelligence of the bunch is none too high – consequently, I think the officer in charge deserve a lot of credit for the success of things so far.


Our death record and sick list have both been used, but nothing startling. A few cases of diphtheria have sprung up which may mean that we will be quarantined for several days upon reaching port.

I have enjoyed watching the ships use their different methods of signaling. They use flags, "wigwag" and "blinkers" one or the other continuously.

The convoy which we have been looking for joined us yesterday morning. A whole fleet of Destroyers. Our other convoy after turning over her charge left us and was out of sight in a half hour. I hated to see her go for she has been so faithful on this voyage and taken such good care of us.

These little Destroyers are certainly diligent – for they are zigzagging all about us all the time. It doesn't seem possible for a "U Boat" to get away – although he might get a shot in someway or other.

This morning I was on watch from 6 to 8. About 7 o'clock I saw something the size of a periscope, about 100 yds off to the starboard. It was black and round and stuck about three inches out of the water. I felt sure it was a Hun boat. I called the control and reported – "a piece of wood or periscope 90° to the starboard." I was a little nervous – I'll admit. It went by tho, and nothing happened. However the ship following us saw it and fired – as far as I could see a very good shot too. Our gun crew was ordered to fire I understand but did not. Consequently some body got "cussed" out, I judge. Some say it was a can, others a fish – and still others a bird – I think it was the former now. All of this was "much ado about nothing" but it pays to be on the job.

For the past day or so the sea has been real smooth. Hardly any waves. It looks like we were in some kind of a Bay – we surely are surrounded by land somewhere.


I have thought about you all a lot and what a good time I had at home not long ago. I'll have lots of things to tell you when I get back – and if I don't – well I will say what Rupert Brooks said not so long ago in a war poem – "If I die, remember only this of me, there is some corner of a foreign land that is forever (England) "The United States."

I have wondered many times on this trip whether or not a voyage at sea would make you sick – That's a funny thing to be wondering, isn't it. You always do on the train and I guess this would be more – so far as I was concerned it was. When we land I guess it will take a day or so to get our "land legs" back.



Naturally, Stuart has been under the weather slightly – not seasickness – a slight attack of lagrippe – He is all right now. We hope to (be) sent to the same place when we get out orders upon landing.

Be sure and have some body write at least once a week and send me all the readable stuff of interest. Must stop and go to the Foretop again -4 to 6 P.M. I am going to write as often as I can. Lots of love to you and all the others.



The "U-Boats" didn't get us after all - I feel a little disappointed in not having a scrape with one and I did look so hard for one - The best I could do was merely a tri-can - but it furnished some excitement. We will probably go ashore tomorrow. Nothing doing to-day. The officers from shore came aboard and checked everybody ref etc this morning. They are unloading the vessel now mail, salt, trunks, etc. I understand that we may not be able to cable so in all probability my letters will be the first news. I'm sorry and will try to get a cable thru. France is quite beautiful so far. Will tell you more later - goodnight -Devotedly your son, Sam





Dear Father,

Your letter came this morning, enjoyed it very much. I received the bedding roll & kit and rain coat as I thought I wrote you. The tools sure did come in handy the other day when one of the Lieuts car went bad and our school fixed it up for him. The school is not doing all the garage work in the regiment. We have fixed up four cars all ready. Did good work too. We have several more jobs to do. The men are very interested in the work. Yesterday we put ten hours on a Chalmers, got it in good running shape too.

My wire about the glasses was caused by am order the colonel got out. It was to the effect that anyone who could get glasses of any sort to do, at once, even if they were just opera glasses. We are firing on the range again and as we had borrowed glasses from the 371th Inf. which is leaving we had to return them. It is very hard to tell what is happening at a target 3500 yds off. That is about two miles. We are surprising all our instructors with the accuracy of our shooting. The men from Ft Sill say they never saw such close shooting at Ft Sill as they have seen here. We are hoping to be real good when the Inspector comes along as on our work depends where we go over. And we are all determined to good. We know nothing besides rumors but we think a lot. 



As I said we know nothing except what is rumored and very few of them. I tried to get that paper sent regularly but it doesn't get out regularly so that can't be done.


