We are still working hard for the note on the Hall. So far we have a little over $$100^{00}$ on the next payment which comes in February. I thought maybe you would like to know.



I saw Dr Arbuckle about my pay. It will be about fifty dollars for both terms. Not as much as I expected but it will help.


There is absolutely nothing doing here. Only work for exams. I'll drop you a card later on the week.

Our Co. was second in Liberty Loan contest for this Reg. in last report.





Each week end brings some news of some body's marriage. I don't know how they feel but I would wait until after I come back. How does Sam feel I wonder. He would never tell me much.


I'm going down to the Express office tomorrow to see about the molasses. I hope it is there. The boys are raving right now over some bought stuff. I want to show them some real molasses.

Charlotte's pictures came to-day. I was glad to get them. Her letter also came.





Most of us have colds but nothing serious.





Dear Father,

School is back in the old running now and everything seems like there never was any Xmas holidays. The boys have almost stopped talking about what they did there. I don't believe I'll forget the enjoyable times I had at home this year. It seemed the most enjoyable of all the Xmas holidays. I thank you, mother, auntie and all the rest for making it possible for us.

We had a very trip to D.C. At Columbus we had a nice twenty minute talk with Fannie Walton and some of her friends. Then in Birmingham we enjoyed the evening with Nell her friend very much. But the best time was in Atlanta. We got in at 6:30 & went to the Ausly (sic). About 10:30 we met Dr Shepherdson & Mrs. Graves & went out to Tech. From there on until Sat. night we were so busy that Sam and I did not do anything but go from one meeting to another. We had lectures, examinations, initiations & banquets. After the first day we went out to a Mrs Lewis for the rest of the time. She treated us great & we had a lovely time. Sat. night we had the banquet. 
Monday morning we bid our new man for the fraternity. We bid nine men but lost one & one would join any fraternity. We are very well satisfied on the whole.
