We appreciate the fine service the air force has given to us in the past on our alums and hope you will make these photographs available to us for the fall issue.



WHAT SURROUNDS YOU IS THE FRUIT OF THEIR LABOR AND THEIR DREAMS. I MIGHT ADD AT THIS POINT, THAT THEIR EFFORTS HAVE NOT GONE UNNOTICED. RECENTLY WE WERE HONORED WITH THE VISIT OF THE SECRETARY OF THE AIR FORCE, JOHN C. STETSON, WHO WAS THOROUGHLY IMPRESSED WITH THE APPEARANCE AND WORKMANSHIP OF THE FACILITY WE ARE DEDICATING THIS AFTERNOON.

THE SPIRIT OF KEESLER CENTER NOT ONLY CONTAINS MEMORABILIA AND PHOTOGRAPHS OF ACTIVITIES AT THE BASE DURING THE RICH AND COLORFUL PAST, BUT IT ALSO INCLUDES MATERIALS WHICH STUDENTS CAN USE TO LEARN ABOUT THEIR CAREER FIELDS, ASSIGNMENTS AND BASES TO WHICH THEY WILL BE SENT. ALSO, THE FACILITY CONTAINS MAPS, ROAD ATLASES AND INFORMATION BROCHURES SO STUDENTS CAN PLAN WEEKEND OR VACATION TRIPS ALONG THE GULF COAST AND OTHER AREAS.

A GOOD QUESTION AT THIS POINT MAY BE WHY NAME THE RESOURCE CENTER AFTER LT KEESLER. THE ANSWER TO THAT IS A SIMPLE ONE -- THIS STUDY AND LEARNING FACILITY PORTRAYS THE SPIRIT OF EXCELLENCE WHICH HAS ALWAYS EXISTED HERE -- THE SAME SPIRIT THAT DOMINATED SAM KEESLER'S LIFE.

THE FOLLOWING IS AN EXTRACT OF A LETTER WRITTEN BY

1ST LT. STUART GILCHRIST WHO KNEW KEESLER IN FRANCE, WHICH
EXEMPLIFIES THAT SPIRIT OF EXCELLENCE I'M TALKING ABOUT.

"I NEVER SAW A FELLOW WHO WAS MORE ANCIOUS TO DO HIS WORK WELL. A HALF-DONE OR POORLY DONE MISSION DIDN'T SATISFY SAM. HE WANTED RESULTS, AND WASN'T CONTENT TO

BE EXCUSED BECAUSE A PILOT HAD MISMANAGED THE MISSION OR A CAMERA HAD GONE BAD... PERHAPS SAM MIGHT HAVE COME BACK FROM THE LAST MISSION IF HE HAD NOT WANTED TO DO HIS BEST."

THE COMMENTS IN THIS LETTER CERTAINLY PORTRAY OUR CONCEPT OF THE "SPIRIT OF KEESLER" AND THIS FAMILY -- EXCELLENCE.

BUT LET'S GO A LITTLE DEEPER INTO THE MAN HIMSELF TO FURTHER UNDERSTAND WHY WE HONOR HIM AGAIN TODAY.

BORN IN 1896 IN GREENWOOD, MISS., HE WAS THE SON OF
MAJ. GEN. SAMUEL R. KEESLER, COMMANDER OF THE MISSISSIPPI
NATIONAL GUARD FOR 8 YEARS PRIOR TO WORLD WAR I, AND LATER
MAYOR OF GREENWOOD, MISS.

HE HAD A BROTHER AND 5 SISTERS. THERE ARE THREE OF THEM HERE TODAY: MR. WILLIAM KEESLER, MRS. MARY GILMOUR AND MRS. ELLA PRATT.

SAM ENTERED THE SERVICE IN MAY OF 1917 AND RECEIVED HIS COMMISSION AT FORT OGLETHORPE, GA. HE WAS ASSIGNED AS AN AERIAL OBSERVER WITH THE 24TH AERO SQUADRON IN FRANCE. ON OCTOBER 8, 1918 HE JOINED PILOT 1ST LT. HAROLD W. RILEY ON A SPECIAL MISSION, IN AN ARMY COMMAND PLANE, A TWO-PLACE "CAMEL," OPERATING OUT OF SONILLY, FRANCE.

LT. RILEY, IN A LETTER WRITTEN THREE MONTHS LATER, TELLS WHAT HAPPENED ON THAT EVENTFUL DAY:

"IN THE LATE AFTERNOON OF THE 8TH OF OCT. 1918. LT KEESLER AND MYSELF WERE ON A MISSION EAST OF VERDIN. SHORTLY AFTER WE CROSSED THE LINE AND JUST BEFORE WE HAD COVERED THE ASSIGNED TERRITORY, FOUR FOKKERS CAME FROM THE FRENCH SIDE OF THE LINE AND ATTACKED US. I AM CERTAIN LT KEESLER SHOT DOWN THE LEADER AS HE ATTACKED FIRST, AND I SAW HIM GO DOWN IN A STEEP NOSE DIVE. THE OTHER THREE OPENED FIRE IMMEDIATELY AND SHOT AWAY MY RUDDER CONTROLS, A PART OF MY ELEVATORS AND CRIPPED ONE AILERON, WE WENT DOWN OUT OF CONTROL AND CRASHED. LT KEESLER FIRED ALL THE WAY DOWN AND AFTER WE CRASHED. ALTHOUGH KEESLER WAS WOUNDED SIX TIMES IN THE CHEST AND ABDOMEN. HE SHOWED A WONDERFUL DEGREE OF SELF-CONTROL AND WON THE ADMIRATION OF ALL THE GERMAN SOLDIERS WHO CAME TO LOOK AT HIM."

HOSPITAL. IN RECOGNITION OF LIEUTENANT KEESLER'S GALLANTRY, CERTAIN ORDERS WERE. MARCH 27, 1919 BY GEN. JOHN J. PERSHING, AEF COMMANDER. LATER LT KEESLER WAS POSTHUMOUSLY AWARDED THE DISTINGUISHED SERVICE CROSS.

AND AS YOU KNOW, KEESLER AIR FORCE BASE BEARS HIS NAME AND NOW, TODAY, THIS STUDY CENTER -- IN TRIBUTE TO ONE OF AMERICA'S EARLY AIR HEROS.

LET ME CLOSE BY READING TO YOU A PORTION OF A LETTER I RECEIVED FROM CHARLOTTE, KEESLER'S SISTER, WHO COULDN'T BE WITH US TODAY BECAUSE OF HER FRAIL HEALTH.

HER COMMENTS, AS A SISTER, ABOUT HER BROTHER'S SPIRIT AND COMPETITIVE NATURE TRULY REFLECT THE VALUES THAT WE ARE TRYING TO INSTILL IN THE YOUNG MEN AND WOMEN HERE AT KEESLER.

"I REMEMBER SAM SO VIVIDLY AND I FEEL THIS NEW CENTER
IS A GLOWING TRIBUTE TO HIS MEMORY. HE WAS GENTLE,
KIND, PATIENT AND WISE FOR ONE SO YOUNG, BUT A FIERCE
COMPETITOR AND A GREAT FIGHTER. HE HAD PLANNED TO DEVOTE

KEESLER AFB, Miss. -- "Today is a great day for Keesler and for the Keeslers."





April 8 of the "Spirit of Keesler Center."


The base name and the new facility honor the memory of Samuel Reeves Keesler Jr., an aerial observer from Greenwood, Miss. Keesler, a second lieutenant, was shotdown over France in October 1918. He died a day later in a German field hospital where he was a prisoner of war.

His brother, William Keesler of Cleveland, Miss., will attend the dedication along with other relatives of the World War I officer.


